Club News and Information

The Board held pre-season meeting Feb. 23, 2018 with several agenda items.

- The club received a letter from the Rice Museum delivered to the Redmond Senior Center and requesting we buy a club membership for the year (\$500). The Senior Center told us they didn't want club correspondance coming to the center.
 - * The suggestion was made to get a Post Office box. Since officers email addresses are published in the newsletter and is on our website, we will not get a Post Office box.
 - * Employees of the Rice Museum have presented programs to the club two years running and we haven't provided any compensation. The Board recommends that the club donate \$300 to the museum this year in appreciation of their efforts, but we don't have the income to provide the museum \$500 in annual dues. This will be presented for a vote in the March general meeting.
- The club received a request to join the Oregon Council of Rock and Mineral Clubs. * The decision was to not do so.
- The Board previously had authorized research into publishing software for the newsletter. We will not be buying any at this time.
- The Board discussed speaker fees and mileage reimbursement for field trip scouting.
 * The consensus was both efforts are a labor of love and the subject was tabled.
- The club has had problems with speaker-supplied computers interfacing with our projector.
 - *Elizabeth and Suzie will research computers and present a recommendation for a computer for the club to purchase. (Any geeks out there, we would appreciate your suggestions!). This will presented for a vote of the membership before any purchase is made.
- Cigar Box Rocks has a 10% discount to local club members. They have offered to sign up customers who aren't members so that such customers can get their discount. They would forward the membership forms and the dues to Marty.
 - * Offer accepted.
- General meeting format the meeting needs to be a little more concise.
 - * The Program will be first instead of last
 - * There will be a maximum of 10 door prizes.

- * Minutes are already published and don't need to be approved.
- * Federation, upcoming field trip, and upcoming program reports are necessary; Treasurers, newsletter, website/facebook are not and will be eliminated unless there is a vote for a purchase being undertaken, then we need a Treasurer's report.
- Marty is keeping a roster of members who have or haven't signed the liability release form. Field Trip Leaders will have the roster and copies of the form. Those who haven't signed but wish to attend the field trip must sign the form. This will apply to any visitors also.


