Samples of petrified wood, angelwing agate, and thundereggs were shown. There are no field trips scheduled in July and August. The remaining trips for the year are:

**Sunday, September** 9 – \*\*Change of location\*\* Trip to Glass Buttes for obsidian. There are locations with gold sheen, silver sheen, mahogany, green, pumpkin, double flow, and rainbow obsidian that the club will be visiting. The trip will be led by Don Ross and John Moreau.

Saturday, October 13 – Congleton Hollow for agate limb casts led by Elizabeth Prindle.

**November** – Annual Club Holiday party and Potluck – details to be announced.

**Federation Report** – Clara Walker has name tags for new members. She announced that 125 club flyers were distributed at the Prineville Pow Wow, and she thanked club members who helped man the display case at the Pow Wow. She welcomed members and guests, and guests were invited to introduce themselves.

**Program** – Al Liebetrau presented a very interesting talk on fluorescents. All minerals and rocks reflect light, but certain rocks and minerals reflect light energy that we can see. The use of ultraviolet light (UV) is needed to see the fluorescence. Al brought many different samples of rocks that are fluorescent under different types of UV light.

Door prizes were distributed, and the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.


