**Presentation** – Daniele McKay, geology instructor at the University of Oregon, gave a very informative and interesting talk about Oregon opals. Her passion for geology was evident, and her enthusiasm was contagious. She is a volcanologist and specializes in the study of the cinder cones in the Oregon Cascades. She discussed how opals are formed, where and why they occur, and the different types of opals. The Central Oregon Geosciences Society meets once a month at the downtown Deschutes Brewery Tap Room from September through May. Doors open at 5:30 p.m and the talk begins at 7 p.m. In addition to speakers, they also have field trips to learn more about the geology in our area. - The Vice President carries out any special tasks that may be assigned by the President.


### Treasurer's Duties:


- The Treasurer receives all monies paid to the Club, deposits them in the Club's bank account, and pays all bills in accordance with policies established by the Board.
- The Treasurer keeps accurate records of all financial transactions and presents monthly financial statements to the membership and the Board as requested by the Board. At a minimum, financial statements should include the period of time covered by the report, a beginning balance, a summary of receipts and disbursements, and an ending balance.
- The Treasurer preparse an annual budget as requested to assist the Board with financial planning to meet anticipated expenses.
- The Treasurer maintains a current list of active members. This list is distributed to the Board, the Editor of the newsletter, and other members of CORC as directed by the Board.
- The Treasurer acts as the representative of the Club in all financial matters not specifically identified here.
