Regular meetings are held at the Redmond Grange, 707 Kalama Avenue, Redmond, starting at 7:00 pm until 8:30 or 9:00.


NOTE – No regular club meeting this month. Please plan to attend our annual summer picnic. Details below.

Executive Board Minutes from July 17, 2019

Attending the meeting were: Deb Simon, president; Marty Betsch, treasurer; Suzie Meeker, secretary; John Moreau, field trip chair; and Clara and Del Walker, Federation representatives. The meeting was held an hour before the regular club meeting. The proposed revision to the Club By-Laws regarding the removal of members was discussed. The Board agreed to bring the revised version to the general membership meeting in September for approval after publication in the newsletter. [Please see the Proposed Revision to Section 3e of CORC By-Laws in the newsletter.] The Board also discussed the pros and cons of purchasing Directors and Officers insurance. This would be in addition to the liability policy that the club already has. The discussion was tabled until September. Junior memberships were discussed, and the Board agreed to bring the proposal for junior membership to the general membership meeting directly following the Board meeting. Additional items discussed were the club picnic and the creation of an annual budget.

Proposed Revision to Section 3e of CORC By-Laws

- 3e. **Removal of members** After following the procedures as outlined in Roberts Rules of Order, a member can be expelled from the club by a unanimous vote of the Executive Board for:
 - 1) Any flagrant or continued violation of the By-Laws or
 - 2) Any disruptive or unlawful conduct that violates the rights and privileges of other members or property owners

DRAFT Minutes from CORC Meeting on July 17, 2019

Welcome and Introductions – Deb Simon, Club President, called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. and welcomed all. New members and guests were introduced. There were approximately 34 members and guests in attendance. Deb reminded all that no food or drink was allowed in the Grange Hall. All attendees were asked to sign in for the door prize drawing later in the evening.

Program – Al Liebetrau presented an informative and entertaining program on "Documenting Your Collection".

Treasurer and Secretary Reports – Marty Betsch gave the treasurer's report. Funds go to paying room rental, liability insurance, and refreshments at meetings and club parties. Suzie Meeker reported several corrections to the June club meeting minutes: minutes in the newsletter will be noted as Draft minutes until the club votes to approve them; any ideas for future programs should be directed to both Deb Simon and Don Ross; the minutes will include only actions or decisions made at the general membership meeting; and no extra copies of last year's Federation directory are available. If you want a new directory, the cost is \$10. Please see Clara Walker. The club voted to approve the June meeting minutes as amended.

Election – Patricia Moreland was elected the Club's new Vice President.

Club picnic – The club's annual picnic will be Saturday, August 24, at the American Legion Park in Redmond. Set up starts at 10-11 a.m. with plans to eat around 12 noon. The park does provide electricity. Please bring chairs and folding tables if you have them. Shade structures would also be helpful. The club provides drinks and ice, hotdogs and hamburgers along with condiments and paper goods. Please bring a side dish or dessert. Helpers are needed to cook on the two gas BBQ's. You are welcome to sell rock-related items; please bring your own shade and tables. The highlight of the picnic is the Silent Auction, which is the club's only fundraiser of the year. Please bring rock-related items to donate. Marty, club treasurer, will accept checks or cash.

The NW chapter of the Fluorescent Society is meeting that same weekend at Al and Sue Liebetrau's house. They have invited everyone to come to their house after the picnic around 3:30 to 4 p.m. Al and Sue have an amazing collection on the lower level of their home in Powell Butte. Junior Memberships – The club reached consensus that junior memberships would be available to children under 18 such as grandchildren or friends of the family. The cost would be a one-time payment of \$5. Forms would need to be signed for liability and supervision of the children. The next step is the development of the forms before formal approval.

Field trips –

Sunday, September 8 – **CHANGE OF LOCATION** – The Whistler Springs trip has been changed to Bear Creek due to lack of quality collecting material at Whistler Springs. There is petrified wood at Bear Creek with a couple of large visible logs. Please plan to meet in Bend at the Costco parking lot near the tire center at 9 a.m. High clearance vehicles are recommended as there are dirt roads leading to the site.

Saturday, October 12 – Mile Post 32 near Post for petrified wood, crystals and leaf fossils.

Fall trip to McDermitt – Dates to be determined. McDermitt has a large variety of minerals and is on the Oregon/Nevada border. There is a private campground in the small town. There is now a gate on the east side of McDermitt on the reservation blocking the Quinn River access.

Federation News – Clara and Del Walker shared news from the Federation. The annual meeting of the Northwest Federation will take place in Lewiston, Idaho, on October 18-20, 2019.
