

The *CENTRAL OREGON ROCK COLLECTORS* (CORC) is an informal group dedicated to sharing the rock hound hobby. We meet for field trips, collecting rocks, monthly programs, and related activities. You do not have to be a member to attend meetings. However, you MUST be a member to participate in field trips. Yearly memberships are \$20 for individuals, or \$25 for households. A membership form is on our website, which includes a liability release for field trips.

Welcome: Rockhounding is best when it is shared. We welcome visitors to our meetings, anytime. If anyone has any interesting adventures or unusual materials that they would like to share, we would love to hear about them.

The Club normally meets the 3rd Wednesday of the month, March through October, except for the month of the summer picnic in August. The November meeting is a potluck holiday get-together on a Sunday. There are no winter meetings (Dec-Feb). The Club address is CORC, PO Box 6265, Bend, OR 97708.

Two Field Trips Planned in September: McDonald Ranch/Polka Dot Mine and overnight trip to McDermitt OR/NV

The September field trip to McDonald Ranch for petrified wood, angel wing agate, and thunder eggs is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 10. This is a fee dig so you will pay for what you take with you. The fees vary from \$2 - \$3/lb. The Polka Dot Mine is the second stop for the field trip, which is in the same area north of Madras. This is also a fee dig for polka dot agate and thundereggs. We will meet at 8:30 AM at the Madras Safeway parking lot, just on the north side of the Safeway gas station. Please bring cash for the rocks that you decide to buy at both locations. Looking for Cool Places to View Rocks and Minerals?

We are fortunate to have two excellent rock and mineral museums in Oregon.

Rice Northwest Museum of Rocks and Minerals – located at 26385 NW Groveland Dr, Hillsboro, OR. (near Portland) The Rice Museum is open Wednesday through Sunday, and the hours are Wed/Th 10-4, and Fri-Sun 10-5. Reservations are suggested but not required. This museum has an outstanding collection of Pacific Northwest rocks and minerals as well as specimens from around the world. It is truly a MUST SEE. There are various special events throughout the year. All Oregon youth are admitted free with one adult regular admission through October 2. Crater Rock Museum – located at 2002 Scenic Avenue, Central Point, OR. (near Medford) The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday from 10-5 pm.
